*¹ Whether in Puna, Kohala, or Moloka'i, Fr. Damien went everywhere to be with his parishioners, hiking the pali on foot, riding in canoes, and horse riding for miles.
*² Saint Damien truly loved his people, and spoke Hawaiian. He treated all with dignity and respect, and expressed compassionate solidarity with the ill in life and in death.
*³ Damien was a member of the missionary Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. Born in Tremolo, Belgium in 1840, he died in Kalawao, Moloka'i in 1889. His feastday is celebrated on May 10, the day he arrived in Kalawao.
