From Kalawao one can admire and wonder at the stunning precipices of North Moloka'i. Oloku'i with the world's tallest sea-cliffs, surrounded on either side by the great valleys of Wailau and Pelekunu. When it rains heavily, waterfalls appear almost everywhere over the cliffs, some scarcely following their course, simply leaping into the sea. The 132-foot tall Kalaupapa lighthouse was completed September 1, 1909. Its beacon still nightly illuminates the ocean expanse that surrounds Kalaupapa peninsula. Those who live in Kalaupapa and those who have visited Kalawao can attest to Kalawao's singular natural and spiritual beauty.
