RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES AND BLESSING THE ASSEMBLY WITH HOLY WATER (In Easter Sunday Masses which are celebrated with an assembly, the rite of renewal of baptismal promises is repeated after the homily, and replaces the profession of faith)

[The deacon or presider invites the assembly to stand and renew their baptismal promises]

(♫) Dear friends, through the paschal mystery, we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that we have completed our lenten observance, let us now renew the promises we made in baptism when we rejected Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church.
